Market Sale Committee Rules are:

1. At the time of the sale, sellers shall pay a 5% fee on entire sale price -2% administration, 3% property improvements.
2. The sale will be a premium only sale of on foot animals with all animals continuing to be the property of the member. Hams/bacon will be the property of the buyer immediately after the sale. All entries are to be shown and offered at the livestock sale by the member. Only exception is a conflicting 4-H or FFA event. The board does not assume ownership of any animal or ham/bacon offered for sale at the livestock auction. The member and family are responsible throughout the process.
3. Champion & Reserve champion animals will be required to remain at the fairgrounds until 8 a.m. Saturday 7-24. Other animals will be released at the conclusion of the entire sale after the ring master's announcement of release. Any animal that will participate in the master showmanship competition Friday is welcome to stay on the grounds.
4. Early release will forfeit sale premium and point money.
5. Buyer shall make payment to the fairboard IMMEDIATELY UPON CONCLUSION OF SALE or make arrangement with the clerk.
6. Sale order follows class placing in each livestock category.
7. Exhibitors may sell only one item at auction. The only exception is when an exhibitor has a grand or reserve champion in two different projects/species. In this case 2 items may be sold.
8. Goat market animals can be wether or market female.
9. Meat project bacon entries must be USDA inspected. No white ribbon bacon entries will be sold.
10. Meat project hams must be USDA inspected. No white ribbon ham entries will be sold.
11. No bulls, bucket calves, guinea pigs, or horses may be offered in the premium sale.
12. All member checks must be cashed within ninety days.
13. To sell livestock and/or hams, member must comply with Federal tax requirements. The W9 form shall be included with registration forms submitted to the Cooper County Fair Board. Ham/bacon sellers must also comply with fair entry rules requiring that participant must either show a livestock project at the fair, participate in shooting sports with a minimum requirement of 10 hours of practice, or have at least 3 exhibits for judging in the building in addition to a ham/bacon project submission, excluding open shows submissions.
